Time for a good read ...

Too cold, frozen, wet and windy to be in the garden, other than to make quick checks on the delightful snowdrops, daffodils and tulips pushing their way up. The weather is the best excuse to indulge my reading habit during the day. Why does it still feel so wicked to read for pleasure during the day? I do so with increasing admiration of the local writing talent.

One of our own members who many of you will know, Barbara Warner, is now a published author under the pseudonym Hannah Nash. "Beyond the Dark Depths", published by Aspect in January, is the story of one woman's descent into and long journey out of depression. *"It is beautifully written, honest and compassionate a dark subject turned into a page turner."*

Mary Sim, another u3a member, has also been published. Grief is something that affects us all at some time in our lives: this past year probably more than ever before. This book has been written out of the author's own experience and that of many others the book is titled "Help! Someone's Died".

Fuller reviews of these two books accompany this newsletter.

I took up the recommendation from The Readers to get a copy of "The Berlin Shadow" by Jonathan Lichtenstein (book reviews accompanying Newsletter 6). I enjoyed reading the book, identifying with so many of the local places mentioned, and what an insight into a nearly "touchable" time in history and the effects down a generation on a father and son relationship.

"The Secrets of Saffron Hall", written under the pseudonym Clare Marchant, is an easy and enjoyable time slip historical novel. The book is dedicated by the author to her mother, Sheila Hollingworth, whom you may also know as she was for many years the chair of the Llandrindod Wells Art Group.

Now I feel I must reread some Iris Murdoch, as I have only just discovered that her friend and biographer Peter Conradi lives near Bleddfa where Iris spent much of the last period of her life. I am not sure I could tackle Peter Conradi's 700 page biography of Iris Murdoch but his more modest sized book about the Welsh Marches "At the Bright Hem of God" is, I am told, a delightful read.

This month's welcome contribution from our own talented writing group is the result of a challenge. The Creative Writing groups monthly topic was "At the end of the pier", but took some time out to respond to an additional little challenge – to rewrite any nursery rhyme of their choice without using the letter E! Some of the results are attached. I challenge you all to have a go yourself! Do send us your own works!
